What is Alternate History?



Wikipedia definition:


• A subgenre of speculative fiction in which one or more historical events have occurred but are resolved differently than in actual history.




An alternate history requires three conditions:





- 1) A point of divergence from the historical record, before the time in which the author is writing;
- 2) A change that would alter known history;
- 3) An examination of the ramifications of that alteration to history.




Some famous examples:





- Isac Asimov's short story What if... (1952)
 - A couple explores alternate realities through a television-like device
- Philip K. Dick's novel *The Man in the High Castle* (1962)
 - Nazi German and Imperial Japan won World War II
- Philip Roth's novel *The Plot Against America* (2004)
 - Roosevelt is defeated in the 1940 presidential election and US features increasing fascism and antisemitism



Not only novels (and movies)






- Mockumentaries: mock + documentary
 - A show depicting fictional event but presented as a documentary
- An example: *DeanDemocracy* (2020)
 - <u>Point of divergence</u>: James Dean survived his 1955 car crash
 - Change in history: he enters politics and becomes President of the US in 1968
 - Ramifications: they challenge dominant narratives, affecting American memory culture




Alternate History and Al
